NOSSI COLLEGE of ART

PURPOSE OF THE AWARD

To award an individual who has shown exceptional creativity in the visual arts by being selected the Gold or Silver Key winner of the Scholastic Art Awards, Nossi offers winners four hundred dollars (\$400) each semester for a maximum total of six (6) semesters equaling \$2,400 for our Associate Degree Programs or eleven (11) semesters equaling \$4,400 for our Bachelor Degree Programs. It is disbursed to the recipient after the midterm exams of each semester as the student makes satisfactory progress through the program.

RECIPIENTS NOTIFICATION AND ACCEPTANCE

A notification is sent to the winners of the contest. The recipient must officially accept the award offered by the college and agree to abide by the rules and regulation of the award committee.

CONDITIONS FOR CONTINUATION OF THE RECEIPT OF AWARD

The college believes that all award recipients must maintain the high standard of academic excellence that has become a standard at Nossi College of Art. To encourage and foster the excellence in education, the recipient must therefore make at the very minimum a satisfactory progress throughout the length of the program.

Satisfactory progress for the purpose of the award is defined as:

1. Maintain a minimum of "B" grade point average.
2. Pass all subjects.
3. Maintain satisfactory attendance record as described in the attendance policy of the college catalog.
4. Meet all financial obligations.
5. Be enrolled in good standing at the time of rewarding of award.

To insure that the student has met satisfactory progress during the first semester, the award will be given to the selected students after the first midterm examination results are completed. Subsequent disbursements are made after each midterm exam of the remaining semesters. There are six (6) semesters in the program. The amount of the award is two thousand four hundred dollars (\$2,400), therefore each semester the recipient in good standing is awarded four hundred dollars (\$400). The award is either credited to the student's account to defray college expenses or the check is made to the student if he/she has fully met his/her financial obligations to the college.

CONDITIONS FOR REVOKING THE ART CONTEST AWARD

Pro-rata disbursement of the award will be terminated any semester when it is determined that:

1. The recipient has failed to maintain a "B" grade point average.
2. The recipient has failed a course.
3. Has not met his/her financial obligations.
4. Is on attendance probation.

O'MORE COLLEGE of DESIGN

- All Gold Key Award winners will receive a \$3,000/yr. scholarship, Silver Key Award winners and Honorable Mention winners will receive a \$2,000/yr. scholarship to O'More College of Design, Franklin, Tennessee.
- The award is renewable annually for up to four years, provided the student is enrolled full-time (12 hours or more) and maintains a cumulative 3.0 GPA.
- The Scholarship is also contingent upon the student applying and being admitted to O'More according to the normal admissions criteria.

WATKINS COLLEGE of ART and DESIGN

\$1500 scholarship awarded to high school juniors and seniors who have won Gold Keys in the regional Scholastic Art Awards competition. Award is applied to first year's tuition at Watkins College of Art, Design & Film and must be used within three years of receipt. \$4000 scholarship awarded to American Vision Award winners (9th-12th grade), distributed over 4 years.

- Based on successful application to Watkins College of Art, Design & Film
- Award is based on full-time enrollment; pro-rated for part-time enrollment
- Award is divided equally between fall and spring semesters
- One award per applicant
